QUICK FACTS - Jerilderie Shire

Location and Population – Jerilderie Shire covers 3, 372 sq km and is situated approximately 300 km north of Melbourne and 600km south of Sydney. Strategically located on the Newell Highway in New South Wales, it is only a short distance from the Hume Highway and is the most direct route from Sydney to Adelaide. Jerilderie has a population of approximately 1,500.



Key Industries – The outlying Jerilderie area is responsible for a large contribution to

Australia's fresh produce industry including olives, rice and organic wines. This thriving agricultural area also produces wheat, soya beans, canola, wool, beef, grapes, and onions, and 25 percent of the nation's tomato crop.

Facilities – Jerilderie boasts quality sporting facilities including an 18 hole golf course, swimming pools, tennis courts, bowling greens, turf race track, and a newly equipped gymnasium and stadium. The Jerilderie Lake is a popular place for waterskiing and general leisure time during the summer months. There is a walking and cycling track around the lake which takes in views of the Billabong Creek.

NSW Long Term Transport Master Plan

The final NSW Long Term Transport Master Plan was released Thursday 13 December by the Minister for Transport, Gladys Berejiklian and Minister for Roads and Ports, Duncan Gay.

The Master Plan brings together all types of transport across all regions of the State into an integrated, modern system that puts the customer first. The Master Plan sets a clear direction for transport in NSW for the next 20 years.

The Master Plan includes 220 short, medium and long term actions underpinned by a four year investment of over \$53 billion in initial funding to lift the standard of transport in NSW. We have also started work on detailed regional transport plans for the regions. These plans will be developed in consultation with local communities to ensure that the unique requirements of the region are carefully considered and planned for.

Issues to be addressed in the Murray-Murrumbidgee region:

- Completion of Holbrook bypass of the Hume Highway (M31).
- Commitment to increasing public transport use to reduce reliance on cars. Flexible bus services tailored to the region's needs will be considered if they will achieve better results.
- Identify and deliver options to improve walking and cycling infrastructure in the region's main centres.
- Bridges for the Bush program part one has identified the need for replacement of the Murray River Bridge at Echuca on the Cobb Highway (B75). This will be in conjunction with the Victorian Government.
- Bridges for the Bush program part two will see the upgrade or replacement of bridges at Tooleybuc over the Murray River and Swan Hill over the Wakool River.

ELSA DIXON ABORIGINAL EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (EDAEP)



The EDAEP provides funding to organisations to support Aboriginal education, employment and training by

- subsidising the salary, development and support costs of Aboriginal employees in a public service agency or local council
- funding innovative community projects
- supporting work experience for aboriginal students in their final year of a degree or post degree course.

Applications under the Elsa Dixon Aboriginal Employment program (EDAEP) open on **Monday 10 December 2012**. EDAEP encourages employment and professional mobility for Aboriginal people in the NSW public service or local government sectors. There are six funding elements under the program:

- 1. Permanent employment
- 2. Temporary Secondment
- 3. Career Development
- 4. Partnership project
- 5. Graduate Work Experience, and
- 6. School-based traineeships

The SBT element provides state and local government with a fully funded Aboriginal SBT position for the two years whilst they complete their HSC.
